**AUSTRALIAN EARLY
DEVELOPMENT CENSUS
New Town conversation**

The City of Hobart is undertaking a project to look at how we can support communities to create supportive, nurturing environments for young children and their families. As part of this project, they will be working with selected communities to help them develop the capacity to identify and respond to child development issues at a local level.

We've all heard the saying 'it takes a village to raise a child', but sometimes that village may need some support too. City of Hobart are inviting you to become a part of the New Town Early Childhood Development Community Action Project, which brings together a group of organisations and individuals who care deeply about providing the best start in life for children in New Town.

This project is possible through a grant from the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC), a program run by the Australian Government that tracks development information about children starting school. This program has been running since

2009, with a census conducted every 3 years.

New Town has been selected to work with because of its vibrancy, diversity and the key role it plays in the north of our city. In reviewing the AEDC data, the City of Hobart recognised that there were child development issues where the community can lead the way in making improvements.

The City of Hobart has collected data, identify the strengths and resources available in New Town, and begin developing a way forward for the community.

This Project is very much a community-led project – it's a chance for you to put in place a foundation for children of New Town. NTCA attended the first forum in Dec'18
